NMIN Lectures

The *NMIN Lecture Series* focuses on the activities and successes of NMIN investigators and/or Network research. These lectures provide opportunities for Network participants and stakeholders to stay up to date with Network research and promote collaboration between Network labs. **Attendance is open to any interested parties.**

NHN Executive Committee

The NHN Executive Committee is a trainee-led committee that advises the HQP Program Advisory Committee and the Research Management Committee on NMIN value-added capacity building and networking programs for HQP. Network HQP elect the NHN Executive Committee members annually.

Pieter Cullis Invitational Lectures

The *Pieter Cullis Invitational Lecture* series feature individuals working at the frontiers of nanomedicines research and innovation and showcases remarkable examples of scientific and commercial progress in the field. **Attendance is open to any interested parties**

NanoMedicines Translated

The NanoMedicines Translated Program support skill development in communicating complex research to the public through clear language summaries, as well as build knowledge around the ethical, legal, and social implications of the research.

HQP Research Presentation Series

The *HQP Research Presentation Series* give NMIN HQP the opportunity to collaboratively develop their poster presentation skills, deliver a presentation in a supportive environment, and receive formative feedback to continue strengthening their research presentation skills. **Attendance at the presentation sessions is open to any interested parties**

Webinars and Workshops

NMIN's webinars and workshops provide HQP training on topics not typically covered in academic settings, including IP management and protection, business, finance and entrepreneurial skills, commercialization skills, leadership and professional skills, and knowledge mobilization.

Advanced Training Certification (ATC)

NMIN ATC recognizes an individual's engagement in diverse capacity-building activities organized by NMIN, its partners, and/or other recognized organizations, where the learning involved goes "above and beyond" the training conventionally provided in an academic program and supports the formation of a well-rounded professional.

Mitacs/Industry Internship Partnership

NMIN trainees have access to earmarked Mitacs Industry Internships, which will provide opportunities for graduate students and postdoctoral fellows to gain valuable workplace experience in short term, sector-specific employment and career-related training experiences in industry.
